

## Sir Alexander Fleming Primary School and Nursery Collective Worship Policy

At Sir Alexander Fleming Primary School and Nursery, the daily act of collective worship is viewed as an integral and important part of school life. It is a time where we come together to celebrate and reflect on school life. The worship of the school is based broadly on Christian values. As such, the contributions of staff, pupils, and other visitors are valued highly.

## Legal Requirements

We acknowledge the legal requirement stated in the 1988 Education Reform Act 6 (1) and 9 (3), which states the need for each child to attend a daily act of worship either as a whole school, class or group. At Sir Alexander Fleming, we provide religious education and daily collective worship for all registered pupils and promote their spiritual, moral and cultural development. Parents have the legal right to withdraw their children from the act of worship either partially or wholly. Any parents wishing to do so should contact the Headteacher. Teachers also have the right to withdraw from leading and taking part in worship.

## Our current schedule is as follows:

Monday: Whole school music assembly (focusing on Christian themed songs) Music assembly led by the music team. Once every month, the assembly is led by School Council and the Senior HLTA who has responsibility for the School Council.

Tuesday: In class reflection time

Wednesday: Curriculum themed assembly led by Headteacher. Once a month, the new value of the month is launched by the SMSC lead.

Thursday: Value of the Month/Newsround/British Values Assembly (in class assembly)

Friday: Whole school 'Celebration' assembly where we celebrate whole school and individual achievement both in and out of school. This is usually led by the SLT.

In addition to this, visiting groups and individuals are welcomed into the school regularly to lead worship.

The assembly/worship usually lasts approximately 15 minutes but this could be longer if for example we have a guest speaker.

Examples of songs covered during collective worship (every Monday)

- □ Who put the colours in the rainbow?

Prayer and Reflection

Collective worship always includes a time of prayer and/or reflection.

Other Faiths

Although our worship reflects broadly Christian beliefs and values, we are committed to respecting all faiths and cultures, showing tolerance and understanding regardless of pupils' beliefs. This is one of our fundamental British Values.

Record Keeping, Evaluation and Monitoring

An assembly file is kept electronically, recording details of each act of worship, themes covered and staff rota. Emails to staff reminding them of festivals/celebrations, communication with religious leaders/connections and other documents are located in the SMSC and RE subject file.

Visits and Visitors

As part of the curriculum, SAF School welcomes visitors to the school to enable them to share their experiences and knowledge on a variety of themes, beliefs and cultures.

The whole school attends and contributes towards annual Harvest and Christmas assemblies when parents / carers are invited to attend.
