Wednesday 22nd April is Earth Day, marking the 50th Anniversary of Earth Day. The theme this year is climate change. We would like you to reflect on the current benefits to the environment, you might like to consider reduced human travel, less need to cut down rainforests and reduced pollution all over the world due to many countries around the world being in lockdown. You can choose how you represent your ideas surrounding this. You might want to produce: a poster, a piece of artwork- maybe using natural resources found in your garden or whilst out for your daily exercise, or you might want to write a letter to the government about your thoughts on the positive impact lockdown is having on the environment. What changes do we need to continue to make as a country once quarantine is over?

Overnight on Tuesday 21st April, in to the early hours of Wednesday, there will be between 10 to 15 meteors per hour. This will be the **Lyriad Meteor Shower**. Meteors will be clearly visible due to it being a moonless night. Can you stay up to watch some shooting stars? In response to this, we would like you to write a **'10 things I wish for'** poem in relation to what is going on in the world currently. Do you wish for all your family and friends to be safe?
