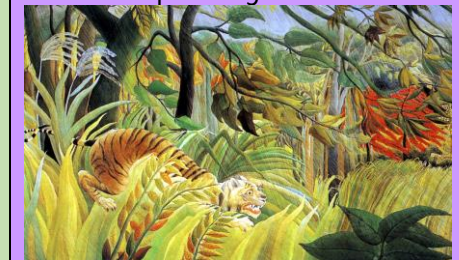
Headdress to Impress

South America has just 12 countries in it. The biggest is Brazil, where you'll find the Amazon rainforest, home to a huge number of animals, plants and insects. Most of this continent is hot and wet, but there are deserts here too, as well as ice-fields.

There's also the highest waterfall in the world – Angel Falls in Venezuela – and famous landmarks like the Christ statue and Sugarloaf Mountain in Brazil. Fond of crisps and chocolate? It's South America we have to thank for potatoes, and for cocoa!

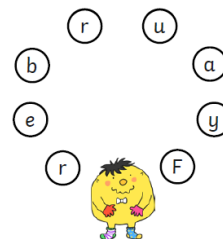

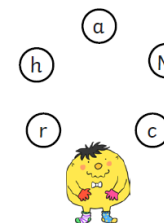

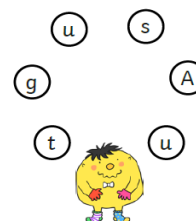

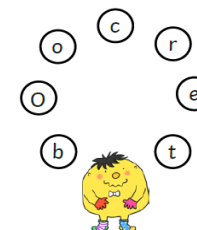

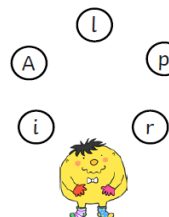
