
Dear Parents and Carers,


Our School Vision and Values is below:

The Big Ask

The Children's Commissioner for England, Dame Rachel de Souza has launched a once-in-ageneration review of children's lives. It's called 'The Childhood Commission' and it will identify the barriers preventing children reaching their full potential and propose policy solutions to address them. At its heart is **'The Big Ask'** – the largest ever consultation held with children. In this survey, the Children's Commissioner is asking children and young people what they think is important for their future and what is holding young people back (please see video link for further information). The children's Commissioner will use what children and young people tell her to show the Government what they think and what they need to live happier lives.

We are keen to ensure that the voices of children and young people in Telford and Wrekin are captured within this once-in-a-generation national review. As such, we would appreciate it if our schools could encourage and support our children in care to complete the survey, which should take only 5-10 minutes.
