

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A Parent's Guide to Attendance

This guide has been composed to share Sir Alexander Fleming Primary School's attendance expectations with our parents. It will explain what we classify as an authorised or unauthorised absence and explain our monitoring processes. All schools are required by law to keep attendance registers for morning and afternoon sessions.

Absences must either be marked as Authorised or Unauthorised.

Only the school can approve the reason for the absence.

At Sir Alexander Fleming Primary School our aim is for all our children to have attendance above 96%

What is an authorised absence?

- If your child is ill and you have contacted the school
- If your child is attending a medical appointment and school have seen evidence
- Religious observance

What is an unauthorised absence?

- Your child not attending school due to birthday celebrations or other family events
- Your child visiting family or friends or shopping
- Your child taking a full day off school for medical/dental appointments
- Your child arriving to school after 9.15am
- Your child being absent with an ailment that school would expect them to attend with.
- Your child taking a holiday during term time that has not been authorised by the headteacher
- Your child missing school due to a medical/dental appointment for a parent/sibling

Punctuality

It is a parent's responsibility to ensure their children arrive at school on time.

School has a clear procedure for the 'start of the school day'. The doors open at **8.30am.** We expect children to be waiting ready to enter their class at 8.30am. The class doors close at **8.45am**

Children arriving after **8.45am** have to enter school from school reception.

<u>Lateness</u>

Children who are not in the classroom at 8.45am, ready to start the school day are late. They will be recorded as late on the class register.

Children who arrive after 9.15am will receive an unauthorised absence mark for the morning session as the morning registers have closed.

All students arriving late must enter school via the school reception where parents must sign their child into school with an explanation of why they are late.



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Late arrival at school may result in:

- Your child feeling stressed or anxious
- Your child learning less and achieving poorer outcomes
- Your child disrupting the learning of others
- Parents receiving a fine if children arrive after 9.15am on a regular basis

Illness

If your child is too unwell to attend, school **must** be notified by 9.15am

Parents <u>must</u> report all absences to the school office via email **A2134@telford.gov.uk** or by leaving a voice message on **01952 327820**. We ask that parents <u>do not give</u> absence messages to teacher or school staff.

Where an illness lasts longer that one day, we ask parents to inform us daily of their child's absence.

If school recognises a pattern of absence, we will contact parents to see if any support is needed and in some cases we will ask for medical evidence that the child has been seen by a GP.

Medical/Dental appointments

We ask that wherever possible all appointments are made outside of the school day. Where this is not possible children should only be absent from school for their appointment and not all day.

For morning appointments we request that your child attends school in the morning to receive their registration mark at 8.30am and then leaves for their appointment.

For afternoon appointments during school hours we ask that your child receives their registration mark at 1.00pm and then leaves for their appointment.

Appointments will only be **authorised where evidence of the appointment** has been seen at the school office. **Without them it will be recorded as unauthorised.**

Leave of absence

Leave of absence in term time can only be authorised by the Head Teacher in exceptional circumstances.

All requests will only be considered if parents have completed a Leave in Absence form. This is obtained from the school office. The Head Teacher who will consider each request on an individual basis.





Attendance Traffic Light Scheme



Below 90%

All pupils who are in the <u>"Red Zone"</u> have an attendance level below 90%. Pupils who fall within this zone are known as being "Persistently Absent" from school and significantly less likely to achieve their potiential.

They will be closely monitored by school and Telford and Wrekin Council

Between 91% - 95%

Warning Signs (may be a cause for concern)

All Pupils who are in the <u>"Amber Zone"</u> have an attendance level which is a cause for concern and they are at risk of under achieving at school

Between 96% - 100%

GOOD ATTENDANCE

All pupils in the <u>"Green Zone"</u> are recognised as having excellent attendance. Pupils in this zone are more likely to do well at school and reach their true potential

What school will do to support you and your child with school attendance

School will

- make contact with you by phone or visit your home if no reason has been given for your child's absence
- undertake a home visit on 3rd consecutive day of absence or if there are concerns about a pattern of absence.
- call for updates if your child has been called in unwell.
- review whole school attendance each Friday. Any children identified as a concern are bought to head teachers attention.
- make contact with you if your child's attendance continues to be a concern. This may be by phone, letter, home visit or an attendance meeting in school.
- work with you put a support plan in place to improve your child's attendance.

Attendance Incentives

School encourage good attendance and punctuality by rewarding pupil's and classes with:

- Schoolopoly— each class with weekly attendance of 95% and above get the chance to roll the die to win a prize
- Weekly 100% Attendance Raffle
- Early Bird Week incentive twice a year
- Termly attendance recognitions for 100% 99% 98% 97% along with best class awards for KS1 & KS2
- Attendance Hero's—A focused program rewarding pupils with improved attendance and punctuality
