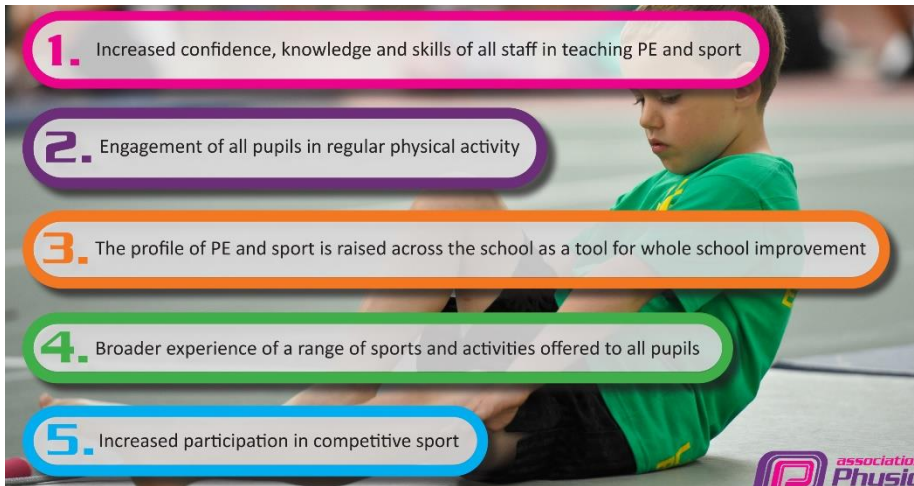

The school development plan outlines these key priorities for the school's PE provision:

- **Improve confidence of staff towards the teaching of PE.**
- **Raise the profile of PE across the school through incentives, sports awards, house competitions, website, and assemblies.**
- **To provide sporting opportunities for all children of all abilities in a wider range of sports.**
- **To link PE with other subjects across the school-maths, science and PSHE.**
- **To support adaptive teaching so that all children can access and enjoy PE.**

All funding must be spent by **31st July 2024.**

Priority should always be given to ensuring that pupils can perform safe self-rescue even if they do not fully meet the first two requirements of the National Curriculum programme of study.
